Planning Priority #1 - Learning Partnerships

By May 2019, partnerships will be cultivated between and among students, teachers, and families and the wider environment to provide students with comprehensive support in their education

Strategies and Success Indicators

- Family partnerships will be fostered, such as K-4 Home Reading programs and reading challenges for Christmas and Summer breaks
- We will continue to serve the community through partnerships with Rest Haven to read with "grand-partners", involvement in Community Christmas projects, The Terry Fox Run, and Community Food Drives
- We will continue to build student-to-student relationships through a mentor (buddy) system
- We will intentionally invite the community into our schools through community partnerships such as Flippers Gymnastics, Hanover Dental, and bringing in parents & grandparent "experts" to enhance learning

Planning Priority #2 – Learning Environments

By May 2019, students will interact in safe and respectful learning environments that foster the diversity of learners

Strategies and Success Indicators

- Students will participate in outdoor learning experiences
- We will continue to build a Trusting Learning Environment through the Elmdale Behaviour Program including that all students will understand the Green, Amber, and Red-Slip Program. In addition, a PrinciPal award will be awarded weekly to one student from each classroom in grades 1-4 and Bucket Filling awards will be awarded monthly to 25-30 students
- Teachers will continue to use Reggio-inspired materials such as Loose Parts to promote hands-on learning

Planning Priority #3 – Pedagogical Practices

By May 2019, Pedagogical practices will be used to design, monitor and assess learning in Inquiry Learning for students

Strategies and Success Indicators

- Students will have the opportunity to explore new Inquiry experiences in their classes and become proficient at communicating clearly relative to their grade level
- All Elmdale students will have the opportunity to participate in regular guided reading programming with their homeroom teacher

Planning Priority #4 – Leveraging Digital

By May 2019, students will leverage digital to accelerate access to knowledge beyond the classroom and cultivate student driven deep learning
