That all students will feel safe and welcome at Elmdale. Strategies and Success Indicators

• Regular school-wide assemblies bring our school community together for learning, celebration, and the singing of the Elmdale school song.

• Student bus captains and lunch monitors showed success in caring for younger students.

• Inter grade buddy reading resulted in connections.

• Among grade 3 & 4 students, belonging, climate, and teacher-student relationships are up 7%, 8%, and 7% respectively, according to the Panorama Survey data.

• Family partnerships were strengthened through the Meet the Teacher and Celebration of Learning events.

• A PBIS based positive behavior support system facilitated green slips, princi-pal, and bucket filling affirmation of prosocial behaviours.

• Partnerships were built with broader community members including the Pistons and Artist in the School. Planning Priority #2 – Literacy

• Deployment of UFLI resources to help students experience success in reading and teacher capacity to effectively teach literacy.

• A multisensory technique by using the Handwriting Without Tears for clarity and confidence.

• Home reading programs to build fluency and comprehension skills.

• I Love to Read month events and activities to affirm the importance of literacy in life.

• Reading clubs built cognitive skills within groups. Planning Priority #3 – Numeracy
